

Objective: A concerned patient, new and previous, will often call an optometrist (OD)'s office to tell us about their new ocular symptoms and problems seeking help. Rather than speaking with a licensed OD right away, they are most likely speaking with an experienced receptionist that knows exactly how to schedule properly. In this interactive session, we will make a "boring" anatomy study into a useful discussion to get you one step closer to becoming this rock star receptionist!



BASIC OVERVIEW OF SCLERAL LENSES FOR SUPPORTING OPTOMETRIC STAFF

TOTAL NUMBER OF HOURS: 1

LEVEL: BASIC TO INTERMEDIATE

Objectives: with the limitation of soft lenses and discomfort in traditional rigid gas permeable lenses, scleral contact lenses are becoming more and more popular in patients with corneal diseases as well as dry eyes. In this basic level course, we will discuss a general overview of how the scleral lenses work and the process of how they are fit. If your office fits them, the staff in this lecture may have a lot of good questions that they could not ask during a busy day in the clinic. If you are at a clinic not fitting scleral lenses, you can and should be knowledgeable when speaking to patients or other offices about patients that may be already wearing scleral contact lenses.



DR. MICHELLE KWON HAS ALWAYS HAD THE PASSION FOR HUMAN BIOLOGY, HEALTH, AND PATIENT CARE FROM A VERY YOUNG AGE. AFTER GRADUATING FROM BEAVER DAM HIGH SCHOOL IN WISCONSIN, DR.
